### Football, Forestry and Furnaces: Keeping the Home Fires Burning During the "Great War"

Students are invited to depart from the well-trodden paths of Flanders' Fields and take a different look at the First World War period. Working from film clips, photographs, oral history recording and archive material students will explore how working and leisure activities continued during the war. The session culminates in a local depth study of a number of County Durham characters and their contribution.

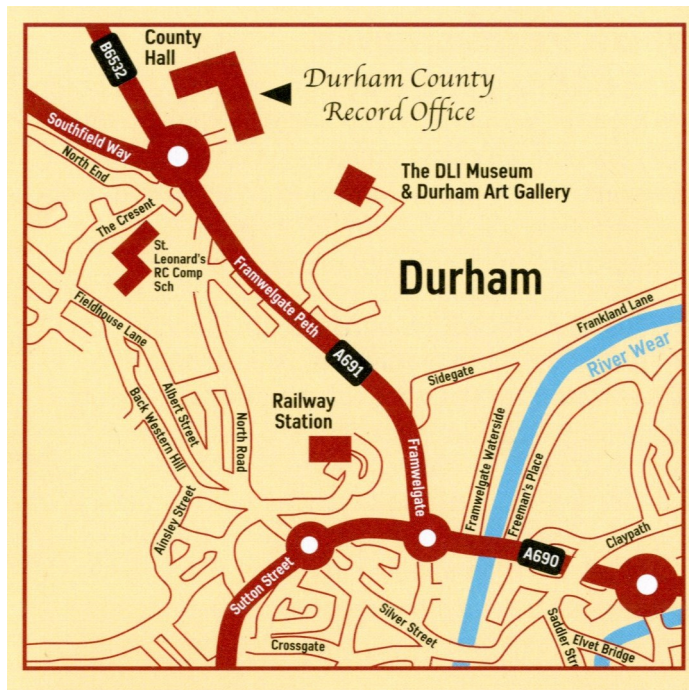
Originally developed for KS3 but easily adaptable for younger age-groups.

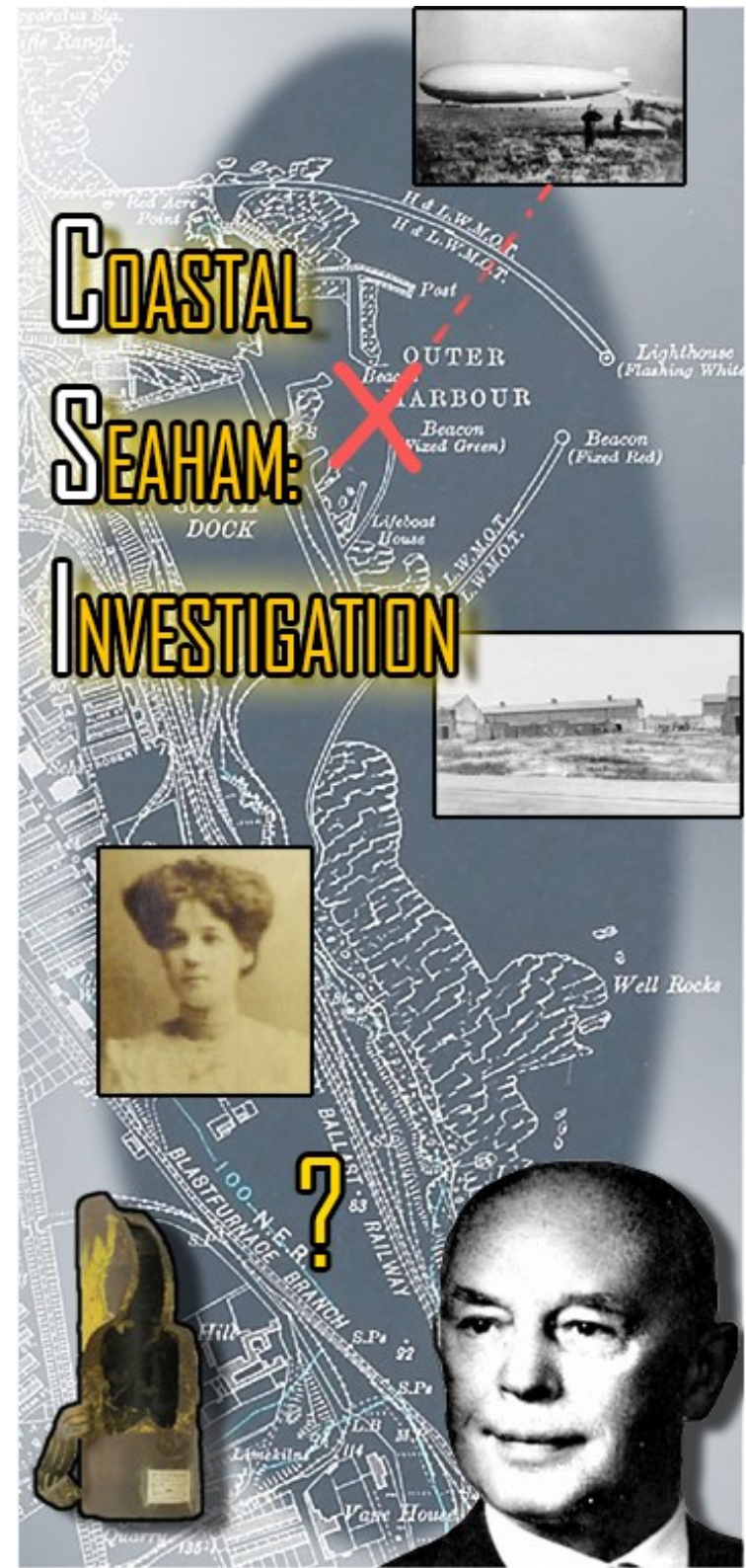
Finish the session with the examination and trail of one of the most notorious traitors of the period.

Use the *top secret* files to investigate!

This workshop uses a wide range of primary sources in English and German to present a local depth study and introduce wider World War One related themes.

The session aims to add to student's word banks; offer reading strategies; develop research skills and introduce students to the archives.

Designed for Key Stage 3 class but can be adapted for other groups.
