Hi, I'm Dawn and I'm the Education and Outreach Archivist at Durham County Record Office. I'm here to guide you through your Arts Award.

This first video is just a bit of an introduction, to explain what Arts Award is and how you can make your Arts Award journey with us.

At Discover level, which is the one you'll be doing with us, Arts Award is really about exploring the arts, having a go and then sharing what you've done and learned.

So, what do you need? Well, the first thing is our Arts Award at Home logbook, which you can download from our website. It comes as an editable PDF, so you can either print it out and write in it, or type in your answers, whichever you'd prefer. If you would rather complete it electronically, then you can do the art activities on paper and photograph or scan them and send them in with the logbook.

You'll also need some pencils or colours for drawing. They don't need to be anything special, whatever you have around the house will be fine.

We'll work through four sections – each has a video on the website and an explanation in the logbook to guide you.

Remember, it's quite informal, if an adult needs to give you a hand with the writing parts or add some comments to explain your work, that's entirely fine.

So, download the logbook and have a go!
